TOP TIPS FOR PEER REVIEW

PRINCIPLES

Be kind and constructive

• Act promptly.

• Take on an objective/ professional tone rather than a familiar/personal tone. Would you use that language in a published article?

• Avoid overly judgemental, emotive language.

PRACTICALITIES

You are not the copy-editor!

• Start with something positive. Does the article deserve to be published? If so, why?

• Prioritise your feedback. Be clear about how relatively significant your points are.

• Provide comments that are specific and justified, so they are easy for the author to act on.
